HISTORY

The Latino Educational Training Institute (LETI) was founded in 1998 by Rosario Reyes, a first-generation immigrant from Peru, as a response to the lack of information and resources available to Latino immigrants. LETI's focus was and continues to be, to help immigrant individuals realize their full educational and employment potential despite the overwhelming disparities and inequities faced every day.

THE SNOHOMISH COMMUNITY ANCHOR

With over 34,000 encounters in 2022 alone, LETI's public setting has become an anchor for the Latino Immigrant Community in Snohomish County. We provide a safe place where people can stop feeling isolated and lonely while they learn and grow. We are a secure place outside their home and work, where they can connect, switch off from the worries of their daily lives, and make new friends and authentic connections, a place that creates immediate equity. Our family of loyal clients need our place to facilitate their resiliency and social equity because LETI is where the invisible are seen and heard.

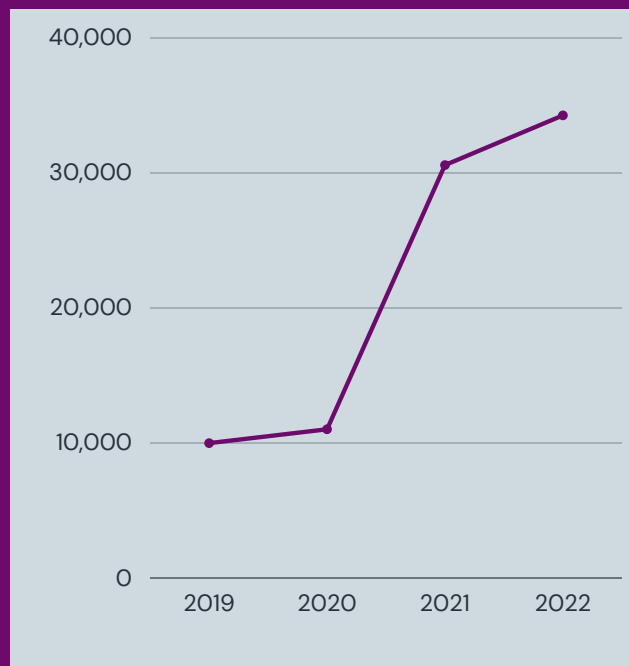

\$45,400 worth of food assistance through gift cards and vouchers through LETI.



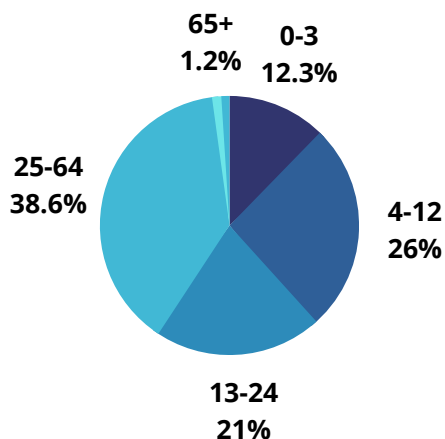
899 food orders served through Edmonds Food Bank.



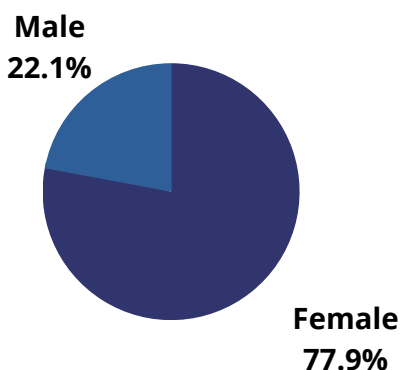
809 Students enrolled in GED, English Conversation, Introduction to College, Pre-Apprenticeship, and students referred.

Current 2023 Client Demographics:

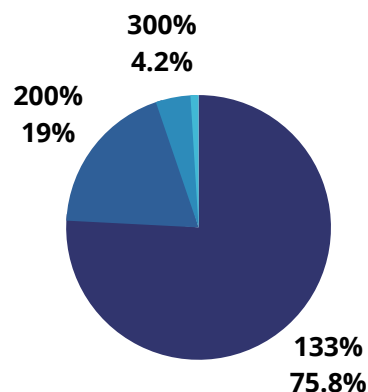
1. Age



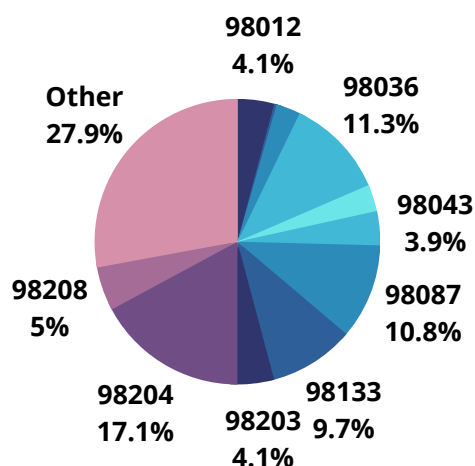
2. Gender



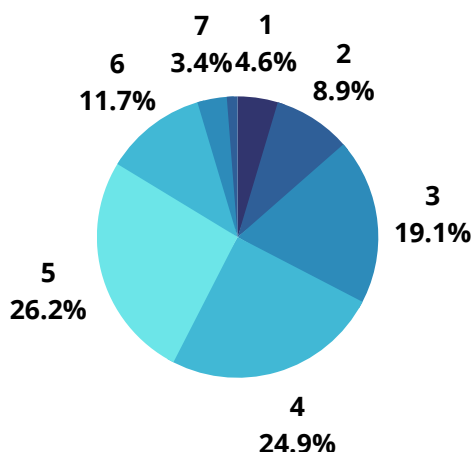
3. Poverty Level AMI



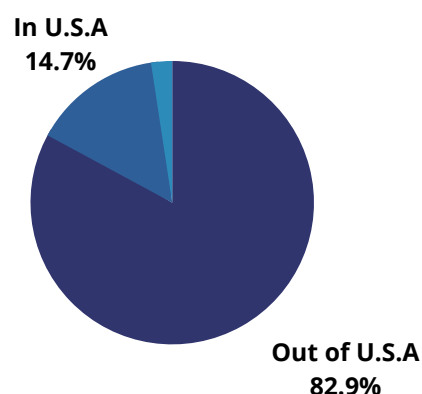
4. Service Area
